


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Continuing the Legacy

Bigger, Better Dream,


The residents of Payatas often face discrimination when they tell people where they are from. In this small over-crowded barangay, reselling trash from the dumpsite is the main source of income for many. However, this same neighborhood is filled with families who dream of sending their children to school and building a better life.



One individual from this barangay is Kathlene Galleta who has been a Megaworld Foundation scholar since she was in second year high school. She is currently taking up accountancy in the Polytechnic University of the Philippines and dreams of becoming a certified public accountant. She dreams of helping her family move out of Payatas, which they have called home for the past 20 years. After she graduates, Kathlene is set to have a secure job at Megaworld.









With both parents making under minimum wage, Daniela Añana knew her dreams could only be so big—and that the potential she had would not match the opportunities she would be given. But after four years of being a Megaworld Foundation scholar, she has expanded her horizons. She is on her way to becoming the first person in her family to finish school.







Both Kathlene and Daniela want people to know that they are more than where they come from, and that with a little help, they can do great things. Through Megaworld Foundation's guidance, both girls developed confidence, stayed motivated and learned important life skills.



Continuing Education

Megaworld Foundation continuously extends a helping hand to deserving students from poor families outside Metro Manila.


Both motivated by the lack of access to quality education in the country,
Megaworld Foundation and Sisters of
Mary School form a strong alliance toward solving the problem. Students enjoy access to food, clothing, shelter, medical care, quality secondary education and an intensive technical-vocational curriculum.













This partnership has helped 46 scholars continue to higher education, and already produced 14 college graduates who are now helping their families. It also provided financial assistance for Sisters of Mary to have clean water supply, after their facilities in Cebu sustained severe damage from a 7.6-magnitude earthquake.











With the help of the Foundation, young students who normally get thrown straight into employment are now given the opportunity to go to college, and later, enjoy better options for their careers.

Prioritizing Wellness

Many students attend class with an empty stomach and bare feet. This is a reality that Megaworld Foundation recognizes, and one that it works to address.




















The Foundation provided new school shoes, sponsored free haircuts, conducted medical missions and held feeding programs for the students of ERDA Foundation. With these basic needs met, students were allowed to truly focus on their studies and enjoy a happier, healthier youth.

Welco-me Home

An alliance with Gawad Kalinga has given Megaworld the opportunity to provide housing for 56 urban poor families in Mandaluyong City. Megaworld employee volunteers came together to help paint homes and turn them over to the community. Part of the volunteers' continuous efforts is to monitor the village and rehabilitate it, with the hope that it can serve as enduring and sustainable housing to its residents, who are always eager to share their own personal home improvements.



















Residents of the Gawad Kalinga Village have experienced a turnaround in their day-to-day experiences. From living in makeshift shacks in the slums, they now have a decent roof over their heads and are able to spend time with their loved ones in a clean and safe environment.

Advocacy for Learning

Making quality education more accessible and giving back to the community—these are advocacies Megaworld Foundation and Adamson University share. Toward the same goal, they join forces for the benefit of hardworking students all over the country.







Education is the Passport to the Future





Over the past 10 years, the Megaworld-Adamson partnership has provided scholarships and eliminated entrance exam fees, so more students have better access to higher education as well as employment after graduation.

The current scholars under the program strive to maintain their grades and stay on track inside and outside of the classroom.

Counselors assigned to them try to understand their situation in order to address issues that may get in the way of their studies. Seeing the Megaworld-Adamson scholars grow and give back is one of the most rewarding things for both parties.





For the Differently Abled

Sharing moments with the neglected and underrepresented in society gives them hope and affirms their sense of self.



Megaworld Foundation visited its differently abled brothers at Sinagtala Home for Boys and gave them extra care by spending time with them and hosting a film viewing, in addition to donating essentials and providing medical supplies.





























Empowering Women & Ghildren

Over the years, Megaworld Foundation has built partnerships with organizations that prioritize the welfare of women and children.

These include the Philippine Foundation for Breast Care, Kaisahang Buhay Foundation and The Foundation for Professional Training.









With the Philippine Foundation for Breast Care, Megaworld Foundation sponsored programs for socialized medical services, breast cancer awareness and spiritual counseling and healing.





Financial assistance, meanwhile, was given to Kaisahang Buhay
Foundation's Nazareth Homes, which houses and provides care for 20 single mothers at a time.



Through these specific initiatives, the Foundation not only gives women and their children a voice, but also promotes the value of respect and appreciation for people from all walks of life.

Gift of Reading

Providing quality education does not stop at giving scholarships and building classrooms. With a shortage of facilities and an overflowing student population already posing major challenges, many public schools are unable to enjoy proper libraries. The absence of quality books means that children miss out on a world of knowledge, imagination and possibilities.

















Megaworld Foundation continues to forge partnerships with other foundations to construct libraries and donate school textbooks as well as storybooks to students. Through its efforts, it hopes to build a strong and educated nation, one book at a time.

Every year, hundreds of applicants apply for a Megaworld Foundation scholarship with the hope of building better lives for themselves and their families. Those fortunate enough to get into the program are met with opportunities as well as responsibilities.





















Megaworld Foundation scholars are expected to not only maintain good grades until the day they graduate, but also develop holistically as individuals. They work on their personal development through programs and outreach events where they understand the importance of kindness, compassion and giving back. By also encouraging the values of integrity, hard work and excellence, the scholars learn to become leaders and movers in society.

They take note that being industrious and persevering are integral in reaching their dreams. They acknowledge that through the scholarship program, they have matured and become more socially aware, as well as preserved the values instilled in them.








Through these services, kids who often encounter speech, eating, hearing and dental issues can now smile and lead happier lives.



Attending law school is rarely an option for those who cannot even afford to get an undergraduate degree. These two Megaworld Foundation scholars dared to dream and beat the odds.



"Now that I am a lawyer, I view life differently.

I have to deal with other people's predicaments on a regular basis. Although these situations can sometimes be difficult, I am grateful that I am given a chance to be of assistance to those with problems."

Hyacinth Aldueso knew that receiving a scholarship meant that many new doors would open for her. She also knew that with hard work, she would finally achieve her college dream of becoming a lawyer. Hyacinth believes that the values instilled in her during her scholarship taught her how to be more generous.



"Success cannot be done overnight, but by persistence and desire to succeed. It is something shared. It is not something na nasa sarili mo lang. Success is something offered to your family and to your community. That is what success is to me."



After receiving her undergraduate degree from Adamson University, Angie-leeca Sevilla knew she could be more. A lack of finances stood between her and her lifelong dream of becoming a lawyer. Despite this, she was committed to make it a reality, no matter how long it took.

Angie-leeca worked as a paralegal during her first few semesters as a law student. She attended classes at night. Eventually, she got a scholarship and took on a part-time job. Today, she is a licensed lawyer in private practice and hopes to work at the public attorney's office.

Health Happiness

Health is often neglected in the less fortunate sectors of our society.

This prompted Megaworld Foundation to take action and partner with DSWD's Golden Reception and Action Center for the Elderly and Other Special Cases, Operation Blessing Foundation Philippines as well as AFP's Civil Military Operations Group, another advocate of better access to health care.

































Free check-ups, medicine and vitamins as well as counseling and spiritual support are offered during the Foundation's annual medical mission. These gives assurance to children and the elderly that their health and well-being are still a priority.

Greener Tomorrow

Megaworld Foundation teamed up with other foundations to save the last surviving rainforest in Metro Manila. Part of its sustainability efforts included tree planting activities which aimed to protect the country's natural resources.




















Seeds were sown in the hope that these will grow large trees, which would protect the land from flood erosion as well as help clear the waters, freshen the air and preserve wildlife.

The Aetas of Tarlac were puzzled when asked about their dreams. Their feet were bare. The nearest school took 4 hours to reach on foot via a hot, dry trail. They simply could not see a future outside their humble village.

Just imagine, the kids will be spared from the daily hike through mountains and the crossing of rivers during school days. These would surely translate into higher enrollment and more literate children.



Hopefully, with more literate Actas, they would be less prone to abuse by some lowlanders who grab their ancestral lands or buy their farm produce at extremely low prices. Everything changed when Megaworld Foundation rehabilitated their school, constructed a dorm and established a feeding program. The Aetas now have a safe space of their own to learn more about the world around them, without worrying about where to sleep or what to eat.

Building Better Classrooms

Another major problem Megaworld Foundation aims to address is the destruction of classrooms in disaster-prone provinces. Through its partnership with Holy Spirit Academy of Irosin and Federation of Filipino Chinese Chamber of Commerce and Industries, more classrooms were built and reconstructed to accommodate the growing number of students, especially after K-12 program was implemented.











Megaworld Foundation helped the institution, and now, its 470 students have five school buildings for their use and they no longer have to study under roofless classrooms. The availability of these spaces has motivated the children to come to school, and the teachers to further impart their knowledge.



Sharing the Lowe

Megaworld employees have responsibilities far beyond their job description. They recognize that they have the power to truly make a difference.





Megaworld Foundation continues to seek new and innovative ways to help those in need. One of its initiatives is continuously involving employees in its efforts. Employee volunteers, already steeped in Megaworld's caring culture, are invited to apply the value of love for their fellowmen outside the context of the workplace.













A volunteer's act of sharing time and talent with others is far greater than goods or monetary donations. The efforts of Megaworld employees in helping others and spreading hope allow them to grow personally and find joy and fulfillment. 




